Insurance/Medicaid

- If you have health insurance, your insurance is likely required to cover the entire cost of your PrEP, testing, and seeing your provider.

- If you have Medicaid, your PrEP will be covered with \$3-\$5 copays.
 - If you have a SSN, live in CO, and have low income, <u>click here</u> to see if you qualify for Medicaid.
- If you have insurance through Kaiser, Medicare, or Tricare, please contact a PrEP navigator or your provider for assistance.
- Please ensure you see an innetwork provider. If you need help finding a provider, check out our provider guide.

PHIP

- The state of Colorado's Public Health Intervention Program can cover the entire cost of your PrEP!
- The program can act like "PrEP insurance," or can be used to cover any costs your insurance doesn't cover.
- The program's criteria include living in Colorado, not qualifying for Medicaid, and have an FPL of 500% or less. You can <u>click here</u> to calculate your FPL percentage.

Medication Only

Gilead

- Programs can cover the cost of name-brand Truvada or Descovy
 - Copay card: covers copays up to \$7,200 a year for insured clients
 - Gilead PAP: covers entire cost of medication for uninsured clients with income less than 500% FPL

<u>Viiv</u>

- Programs can cover the cost of Apretude, plus some administration fees
 - Copay card: covers copays up to \$7,500 a year for insured clients
 - Viiv PAP: covers entire cost of medication for uninsured clients with income less than 500% FPL

Other

- GoodRx: may be able to lower the cost of generic truvada.
- <u>Ready, set, PrEP</u>: can cover entire cost of oral medications regardless of income
- Free telePrEP programs or local PrEP studies may offer reduced costs, contact a PrEP Navigator
